Police arrested a male suspect for Possession of Dangerous Drugs

Preliminary reports are that shortly before 12:00 noon on Wednesday 22 September 2021., officers from the Drug Enforcement Unit executed a search warrant on a residence located on Trinity Lane, Stapleton Garden. During the search, the officers discovered a quantity of suspected marijuana and an assault rifle magazine containing ammunition. As a result, an adult male was arrested and taken into custody. The weight of the suspected drugs is 215 lbs. and has an estimated street value of \$250,000. Investigations into this matter continue.

Police arrested a male suspect for Possession of an unlicensed Firearm

Preliminary reports are that shortly after 5:00 p.m., on Wednesday 22 September 2021, officers from the Operations Unit were on mobile patrol on Bahama Avenue. When they observed a bronzed colored Honda Accord with three male occupants, who on seeing the police began acting in a suspicious manner. The driver then fled; a chase ensued. With the aid of a second Operations Unit the vehicle was intercepted at the intersection of Cordeaux Avenue and Washington Street. A field search was conducted and as a result one of the officers discovered a pistol containing (10) ten unfired rounds of ammunition. The suspects were arrested and taken into custody. Investigations into this matter continue.
